ARTIST STATEMENT

2021 Made in California Show, Brea Gallery, Brea CA — Tidy Tips, Part of The California Pollinator Series - Laser cut wood, water based oil paint, pencils, lacquer, gold leaf. Made from recycled laser cut wood scraps, Tidy Tips repurposes the cut outs from an eight foot tall sculpture I created. The cut outs fit together in new and different ways and take elements from mutualistic symbiosis and add them to the trophic chain or cycle of life. This cycle consists of the very smallest living forms as the bottom building blocks with larger and more complex forms depending on those. In the trophic chain, balance exists between flora and fauna, or nothing survives. Tidy Tips is a flower endemic to California.

Here it is made from the scales of butterflies, antennae, parts of insects, wings, mandibles, random shapes, whole butterflies, and other pollinators. This flower is intentionally chaotic, asymmetrical, and full of imperfections. Insects make up the body of the design because they are an important part of the trophic chain. I wanted to highlight them as creatures to be loved and viewed as important, because without them, life would collapse. I have heard too many people complaining about harmless insects and bugs and I just want us all to stop and think about how they enable the flowers and birds, lizards and larger more charismatic creatures to survive. If we want to mitigate the current mass extinction, we need to start with microbes, fungi, and insects. This work is meant to remind us that nothing of beauty and consequence could exist without the balance. Also, insects are just cool.
