ARTIST STATEMENT

Eliciting desire. What is it? Who creates it? **S. P. Harper** answers by focusing on the intersection of rubbish and *objects d'art*. **377 Karats** is a 3D sculpture employing repurposed milk crates and wire. It illustrates how products change from valuable to worthless and re-emerge desirable. Part of eco-centric art, aka neo-materialism, inspired by her *diamantaire* (diamond cutter) grandfather, Harper sculpts and paints abstract geometrics using reclaimed materials, synthesizing historical and contemporary styles by mixing the classical tradition of still-life with modernism.

Through reforming and re-employing elements, her work reduces, reuses and up-cycles. Applying diverse media such as discarded wallpaper, tablecloth, curtain, metal, plastic and wood fragments, Harper employs various disciplines including MIG welding, circular saw (with diamond blade!), table saw, jigsaw and sewing. Background recycled patterns vanished behind opaque oil paint subtly reappear through transparent gem stone dust and acrylic wash. Gods of Fire have been chosen to represent birthstones arranged in a didactic collection. Eternal flames emerge from the facets of jewels to reflect and transfix.
